Mayor Foster, and Members of Council,

I am thrilled to express the sincere appreciation of the Jury Lands Foundation (JLF) for the work undertaken by the Council of the Municipality of Clarington, along with its staff, in achieving a major step towards securing the future for the property and buildings associated with what many call Camp 30, and others, the Boys Training School. The details as released in the Municipality's press release of Friday 17 December 2021 outline immediate steps towards this ultimate objective.

While much work remains for both the Municipality in advancing the intent of the existing agreement, and for JLF in restoring and re-purposing the entire site and associated buildings, I can say on behalf of the JLF that we look forward to pursuing this purpose with the building immediately released to the Municipality.

We request the opportunity to meet with appropriate Council members and your dedicated staff at the earliest possible time:

- To be fully appraised of the details in the agreement and the means by which JLF will assume its stewardship obligation,
- To learn about ongoing measures to ensure the future stability of all relevant buildings,
- To determine a timeline or means by which the transfer of the rest of the property and buildings will occur, and
- To recommend how the landowner's financial transfer can best support JLF's efforts in fundraising, obtaining in-kind sweat equity and professional support, and pursuing grants and other revenue generating activities.

JLF are keen to begin immediately in realizing the practical steps necessary for this purpose consistent with its stated mission. We will continue to harness the groundswell of public interest generated by this challenge.
